TIER 2

NUMBER OF EVENTS

Stops 1 to 3 will consist of the following 9 medal events:

- 4 Individual diving Events (Preliminaries, Finals) *
- 4 Synchronised diving Events (Direct Finals)
- 1 Team Event (Direct Finals)

* There will not be Semi-Finals during the DWC 2023.

COMPETITION SCHEDULE

The programme will be staged over 3 days with 2 days of training prior to the start.

CONDITION OF ENTRY

Stops 1 and 2 – Open to all FINA Member Federations

- ✓ Up to 2 entries per National Federation for the Individual Events
- ✓ Up to 1 team per National Federation for the Synchronised and Team Events
- ✓ Divers competing in the Team Event have to be registered for either the Individual or Synchronised Events
- ✓ To participate, individual divers have to meet the minimum point standards set by FINA at a previous identified event (see Appendix 1). For the Synchronised Events, the standards need to be achieved as the nation. The identified events are as follows for the DWC 2023:
 - Olympic Games Tokyo 2020
 - FINA World Championships Budapest 2022
 - FINA Diving World Cup Berlin 2022
 - Commonwealth Games Birmingham 2022
 - European Aquatic Championships Rome 2022

STOP 3 (SUPER FINAL) – Invitations by name based on the rankings from Stops 1 and 2

- ✓ Top 18 divers for the Individual Events
- ✓ Top 8 teams for the Synchronised and Team Events

ROUNDS

Stops 1 and 2 - Individual Events

- ✓ All divers to take part in 2 split-preliminary rounds and top 12 to participate in the Final

Stops 1 and 2 - Synchronised and Team Events

- ✓ Direct Final

Stop 3 (SUPER FINAL) - Individual Events

- ✓ Top 18 divers to take part in 2 split-preliminary rounds and top 12 to participate in the Final

Stop 3 (SUPER FINAL) - Synchronised and Team Events

- ✓ Top 8 teams - Direct Final

TIER 3

FINA also believes in the importance of supporting International Events to develop and educate athletes, judges, officials and volunteers worldwide while also contributing to the exposure of the sport. We are therefore introducing a *Recognised Events* model to help the community grow and achieve common goals (replacing the FINA Diving Grand Prix events). All Member Organisations can apply for an Event hosted within their region to be a *FINA Recognised Event*. Please find attached the criteria that would need to be demonstrated as well as the form to submit before 1st February 2023.

<p>* Due to the exceptionally high standard of the 10m Synchro Women events, and only 9 Synchro teams participating at WCh 2022, a Women 10m Synchro Team can ask for an exception if they achieved the minimum of 230 points and if there are less than 12 qualified Synchro Teams in the Stop 1. or 2.</p>
